Stand The Creed

In his life he rejoiced in the innocence and beauty of children; in his death he carried in his body the violence and cruelty of our world; in his resurrection he brought life and salvation to his people and began the new creation. As our ascended and merciful high priest, he hears our cries and knows our grief; and will come as universal Lord to whom all must give account. Therefore with all the angels of heaven we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name and sing our joyful hymn of praise:

The God of all creation
Peace and joy the angels' word

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.
